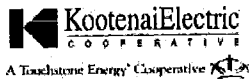

Dear Resident,

We have a very concerning problem, and we would like your help to solve this problem.

In any type of emergency, locating the exact address where the problem is occurring is sometimes extremely difficult to do, even with our GPS systems. We can usually get close, but is "close" really close enough when you need us?

Reflective address signs posted at your driveway entrance, or on your house that are clearly visible from the roadway (both day and night), are inexpensive and readily available. If there is more than one residence on your property, please post both addresses at the street and one on each residence. Reflective address signs are available online and also from local retailers.
