


The last Athol Daze Planning Meeting Tuesday, August 3rd at 1:00pm

Update from Mayor Wachter

- ➤ <u>City Budget for FY2019</u>: The council has conducted a couple of workshops regarding the next year's budget. There are a lot more levels involved with the city budgeting these days. When you begin receiving grants, planning for long term financing, and deal with an overall
 - increase of the daily activities in the city- the general line item budget gets more complex. I encourage citizens to be sure they too are growing their understanding of the budget right along with the council and staff. We will hold a public hearing on September 4, 2018 at 7:00pm for the FY2019 City Budget. There will also be an update to the City fee resolution at that time.
- The USDA application is in, and now the City is planning on applying for an Idaho Community Development Block Grant. A requirement of the funds is to provide income data of the residents within the city limits. In order to accomplish this, an outside consultant for the City, Nancy Mabile of the Panhandle Area Council, will be conducting an income survey to provide the necessary beneficiary data. These surveys will soon find themselves at random households within the City. All responses are essential in order for the City to be eligible for grant funds, which will help offset the costs to residents. When you receive your survey, please follow the instructions to complete it and return it in the self-addressed stamped envelope that will be provided with the survey. - On-Going efforts to get more citizen participation for the updating of the City's Comprehensive Plan are still being made. Only 2 people attended the Open House last month. I really hope more citizens can find the time to help be a part of planning for the future, and not just leave it up to the council and staff. This is your opportunity to let your thoughts and voices be heard.
- **Water Infrastructure Improvements-** to give you an update, we are still working towards preparations for a November Bond Election.
