City Street Repairs: The 3rd week of June we will be repairing some of the city streets; filling in potholes and fixing road breakups. Please be careful and patient if work is happening on your street.

<u>City Hall and Community Building Improvements</u>: The downstairs floors of the building are getting an update. Over the next few weeks the building will be receiving some much-needed work. Please bear with us during this messier than normal time.

Athol Beautification and the City-Wide Yard Sales were a huge success and the weather held out great this year. There were approx. 31 homes that signed up for some sort of help either picking up items for the dump, or having some small repair or yardwork done. We had about 100-120 volunteers who then broke into teams to perform the various tasks.



So much appreciation goes to the volunteer groups like:

Hello, for June I would like to invite everyone to a Joint City Council and Board of Fire Commissioners meeting <u>at City Hall on</u>

<u>**Tuesday June 5th, 2018** @ **6:00PM.**</u> Your Fire District staff will be presenting a presentation to the City Council and Board of Fire Commissioners outlining the direction the District is heading and a little bit of where the District has been. Generally, the District is nearing a financial crossroads where the budget for operating is not keeping up with the growth the area is experiencing. The Board of Commissioners are interested in hearing what our constituents think of the fire services you receive and what you would like to see in the future. The Board is also thankful of the great relationship between the City and the District.

A note from our annual report includes the following: "Our volunteer team continues to grow at a slow pace. However, we believe that quality volunteers are much more valuable to the District than quantity. In other words, our Team is being much pickier than in the past. The trend nationally is that volunteers for most disciples' fire service included are becoming significantly harder to recruit and retain, while training requirements are continuing to increase becoming more time consuming and expensive."
