Did you know . . . your water bill money is used only for the Water Fund. The City has 3 funds (General, Street, and Water)

The only money the water fund receives as income is from franchise/lease fees and water billing. Expenses paid from the water fund include: Payroll,

Operations/Maintenance, and Professional Fees; all costs that are directly related to

running a public drinking water system.



<u>Update from</u> <u>Mayor Wachter</u>





- ➤ <u>City Street Repair:</u> This got pushed back to the 3rd week of July. We will be repairing some of the city streets filling in potholes and fixing road breakups. Please be careful and patient if work is happening on your street.
- ➤ <u>City Hall and Community Building Improvements:</u> The downstairs floors of the building are done. We strive to provide our community with a nice useable space in the city. In less than 3 years' time, the building rental income will have paid for the community center floor upgrades. Stop in and check them out!
- Raising Awareness of Group Use in the Park: As we continue through the summer we are working towards getting more signage up in the park. The city now requires reservations for city park and ballfields use for larger groups. There is no cost to do so, but a small fee if you want to use electricity.
- Check out the recent addition to our City Park: New playground equipment geared for ages 2-5 years old. We are regularly looking at how we can better improve our city and the services it provides. There have been a lot of comments lately as to the safety and comfort of using the city park. While we cannot monitor the park and its users all the time, we are

trying to do what we can. The City Hall staff and I are always willing to listen to thoughts and ideas if anyone wants to discuss them.


Join us Monday, July 23, 2018 from 6 pm to 8 pm at Log Spirit Bed & Breakfast for a delicious fundraiser!




