Look What We Can Do Together



2019 Membership Drive is underway: The Chamber of Commerce is looking for individuals and businesses to become new members of the Chamber. It is a great opportunity to get your business name out there, to get involved with our community and meet our neighbors. Beginning 2019 membership dues will run from April to April, with all paid members for 2018 being credited with three months free membership. Chamber meetings are the 3rd Thursday of the month in the council room at Athol City Hall.

2019 Election of Chamber Director Results: Three 2- year term positions were filled in January. Vice-President will be Josh Baugh, Treasurer will be Ramona Grissom and Director will be Rudy Rudebaugh.

The Chamber hosted an informational meeting on Thursday, January 10th, with Rocky Watson. He was asking the interest in this area for an Abused Women and Children Outreach that would have a satellite with the Boise outreach program. Mr. Watson had some specific ideas in mind; it was agreed that a multi-community effort would be needed to achieve the fund raising required, as well as the base operations. If enough people are interested in this type of program, a second informational meeting can be held at a date to be announced in March or April.

City of Athol Snow Removal Operations

Heavy snowfall is an inconvenient reality for all of us here in the "snow belt" as part of North Idaho Life, but one that our city anticipants and carefully prepares for each winter. A few things we would like you all to remember as major snowfall and accumulations continue to affect our city's streets:



Our City's Public Works Department consists of 1 full time employee, Anthony. He is the snow plow operator, and he works tirelessly around town to ensure consistent and timely snow removal. It is his first year here in the city, so please be patient with him as he's learning the best placement for the snow.



Athol is equipped with a grader, front end loader, and a small tractor/snow blower to mitigate hazardous conditions on our city streets. We have a snowplow gate that is used to help lessen berms.







BERMS

Please understand that he will do his best to be considerate of the hassle of berms. However, the City's primary responsibility is to get all streets clear and navigable. He is often pushing a substantial amount of weight when plowing the snow. One pass is made on each side of the street, so the snow load is allocated equally, except for Northern Meadows, which requires more passes.



ROUTES

For purposes of snow removal, the city has a specific order in which it will be plowed. Menser Avenue, followed by Davis Lane, 2nd Street, 3rd Street, and 4th Street, takes priority for clearance. Then Northern Meadows, the North side of Highway 54, and the East-West Streets on the South side of Highway 54. Lastly, Miller Road and Hill Street. Please be patient, as he's only one guy.





SCHEDULE

Once accumulation exceeds approximately 4 inches, snow removal operations will commence. To ensure streets are cleared for residents' daily commutes, when possible he will start in the midnight to 4am time frame, pending the next anticipated snowfall.



ORDINANCES

Snow Removal. PROHIBITED ACTS: 6-4-4 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave a parked vehicle or other object upon a street within the City during a snow accumulation. C. It shall be unlawful to block, stop, or otherwise impede any snow plowing vehicle or snow plowing operation conducted by or on behalf of the City.

6-4-5 Penalty A. A person who violates any provision of this chapter is guilty of an infraction. **B.** The owner of any vehicle or object removed from a street at the direction of the Superintendent during a snow emergency shall be liable for all costs incurred for that removal.



The U.S. Census Bureau is hiring temporary census taker positions available in Kootenai County in advance of the 2020 Census.

Census takers work in the field. Some field positions require employees to work during the day to see addresses on buildings. Other field positions require interviewing the public, so employees must be available to work when people are usually at home, such as in the evening and on weekends.

Applicants for the positions, which start at \$13.50 per hour, will be placed in an applicant pool for 2020 Census positions for which they qualify, as jobs become available in their area.

Dance lessons are continuing now through spring!


Summer classes to be determined. Current classes:
