

Hello Athol citizens, some basic information about the Levy Override Election on May 21, 2019

Levy Objective: To position the Timberlake Fire Protection District (TLFD), through community involvement, adequate funding and proactive planning, to move efficiently and safely meet the rapidly increasing demands for emergency services and our community's current and future safety needs. *First Levy request in 20 years.*

Brief History: TLFD was established in 1999 as a merger of Bayview and Athol Fire Departments. This is our 20 years anniversary.

- This Levy effort will be the first time TLFD has asked the public for a Levy override since being formed 20 years ago.
- Three of the current seven career Firefighters/EMT's are funded via the Kootenai County Emergency Medical Services (KCEMSS) contract.
- The District maintains and has maintained for 20 years a very active Volunteer Firefighter EMT program to help with staffing & response needs & to help keep operations costs low.

Commercial High	40k	\$52.00
Bulk Rate	1k	\$6.00
Haulers	50 gal	\$0.25

Additional Water Usage (over base rate)	1k	\$2.00



The residential rate is going up, with a small reduction in gallons.

The commercial rates are being restructured, changing the 5 classes into 2 classes.

The "Off" rates for both Residential & Commercial are being eliminated.
