✓ I have begun to gather information on how to get a Quiet Zone for the railroad in the city. I will share as I learn more.



- ✓ <u>We have been attending the Bonner County Area Transportation</u> Team (BCATT) monthly meetings. This allows for us to work closely with the Local Highway Technical Assistance Council (LHTAC), who offers lots of types of grants and networking.
- The City Clerk and Deputy Clerk both just attended the annual Idaho City Clerks, Treasurers, and Finance Officers Association (ICCTFOA) last week in Nampa, ID. This is a great way for small cities like us to ensure our staff gets the most up-todate education and information regarding Idaho laws that govern us. Congratulations Lori for achieving her 5-year Service Award & Tanya on her 1year Service Award with the ICCTFOA.
- ✓ Go check out the new paved Trail that runs along Highway 54 from N. Old Hwy 95 to the new Super 1. This was a combined effort done with money from the developers, HJ Grathol, and from the Idaho Transportation Department, and a very small portion of city funds. Enjoy! This will help to complete some great access as the trail from CDA is getting extended along Highway 95 into Athol.
- \checkmark The Athol Transportation Plan has been approved and adopted by the council. The council felt it was very important to address in the plan, their concerns related to the increasing traffic congestion and pedestrian safety along highway 54 that runs through our city. Our

next steps will be looking into what types of grants we can apply for to help get our streets and signage up to date.

Walktober - I have signed up to Join the Mayors Walking Challenge! The

Blue Cross of Idaho Foundation for Health, through its High Five initiative that promotes physical activity and access to healthy foods for kids, is creating a **#100MayorMovement**. That's right, they are setting a goal of

having at least half of Idaho's mayors participate in the Mayor's Walking Challenge.

- o Mayors wear a Fitbit activity tracker and set out with a goal of walking an average of 10,000 steps per day in October.


