Friday, September 6, 2019 at 5:00pm.

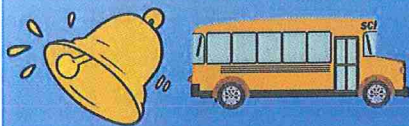
Stop by City Hall to get the information to get signed up.

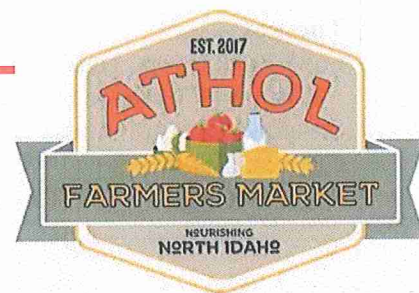
