Public Hearing for the Proposed City

Fee Resolution is Oct. 6th at 6:00pm- For new or increased fees greater than 5%. Some of the proposed fee increases are for Water Rates, Public Assembly Permits, and other Misc. Planning and Zoning fees.

Water Rates for Residential going up \$10.00 a month to \$44.00 a month, Commercial Low will go up to <u>\$52.00</u> and High up to \$68.00 A full copy of the proposed Fee Resolution #2020-08 can be found on the website at:



www.cityofathol.us or stopping by city hall for a copy.

Remember this is a mid-way step towards the promised, not to exceed \$55.00, by the Council, for a Residential Rate. This is part of the Bond passed for Water Improvements in 2018. Construction on this project started late September and you may start seeing various work around town.

NNAC will be starting work at the Cemetery Water Tanks late September and then moving into town to start water line work in Mid-October on. The water line work will begin on 3rd Street then once finished will move to 4th, and then finally Davis St., and should be completed before the end of 2020 if weather does not slow things too much. The work on those streets will take place from HWY54 south to Menser Ave.

✓ <u>The Council is also planning for a City Code Amendment Update.</u>

The last workshop is scheduled for Oct. 6th, then a Public Hearing will be set (tentatively Nov. 3rd or 17th). These proposed changes and official notice of the Public Hearing will also be available on the city website: www.cityofathol.us or from City Hall once they are finished being drafted. Most of the proposed changes are general clean-up in planning and zoning, parade and assembly permits, etc., but it is always good to take a look.


