<u>Water Improvements</u> – The waterline project should start back up sometime this month. NNAC will be continuing to work on the new cemetery tank and finish 3rd St., then begin work on 4th St. for the watermain upsizing.

- There will be two Public Hearings at the March 16th council meeting. One for the Badger Annexation and the other on a Code Amendment request from Active West LLC.
- We have been working on new interior and exterior doors at the Community Center, we hope to have them finished soon.
- The FY2020 Audit has been conducted by Anderson Bros. Final draft should be available on the city website by the end of the month.
- We are tentatively planning for Athol Daze this year. Not sure what it will look like, but we hope to have something for the community.
- Group activities & building rentals are picking up again, as the Governor moves us up in the stages. We hope to be functioning like normal, or as close to normal as possible soon!
