**Bennett Street/Back Parking Lot Area for City Hall** You may have noticed it has had some construction work happening in the last couple of weeks. The fire hydrant has been relocated from the middle of the parking lot, yahoo!





The hydrant is now located across the street, just outside of the park fence, on the southeast corner of Bennett and  $2^{nd}$  Street.

<u>All commercial bulk water haulers will now need to use</u> <u>the hydrant located on the north side of Grove Street</u> and the west side of N. Old Hwy 95 until further notice.

Windstorm Damage - A few weeks ago, that windstorm did some damage to the city park and the cemetery water tank area. In the park, a nearly 85-foot-tall Spruce tree uprooted and fell over, taking out another tree with it. Clean up is nearly finished from that mess.



Another tree fell in the cemetery, just barely missing the brand-new water standpipe. We are working with the insurance company to get a new fence up as soon as possible. Windstorm Damage Continued: Because of the potential for additional trees to fall within the perimeter of the new water standpipe and cause serious damage to the water supply, we are going to do some tree removal at the cemetery. Many of the trees are old, have root rot and will be compromised with some tree removal. Since equipment will be onsite, we are also going to be logging the hillside of the cemetery down to Sheep Springs Road. In addition, a new area will also be cleared to prepare for a future expansion in the cemetery, as the total number of lots available are very limited.



We hate to see trees cut down, but it is part of the cycle and the best for the health of that area. The city will be planning to get new trees planted on the hillside and various areas as soon as possible to get the growth of new trees started.

2) Ordinance #436 - Fire Department Impact Fees (Legislative) This is your opportunity to tell your council if you want them to adopt this Ordinance and Collect Impact Fees for the Fire District and KCEMSS

There are 2 types of Public Hearings, Legislative and Quasi-Judicial.

- <u>A Legislative Public Hearing</u> is your opportunity to give testimony before the elected officials regarding matters of policy. They are less formal, and they <u>do not involve the legal rights of specific, private parties</u> related to an application before the city. They <u>affect a wider range of citizens</u> or the city as a whole.
- <u>A Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing</u>, unlike a legislative one, <u>involves the legal rights of</u> <u>specific parties</u>, and the decisions made as a result of such hearings must be based upon and supported by the record developed at the hearing. They have <u>stricter procedural</u> <u>requirements</u> than legislative hearings. They <u>involve land use matters</u>, including site specific rezones, preliminary plats, variances, and special use permits.

## **PAYING FOR GROWTH**

Over 2,300 new homes are anticipated to be built within the Timberlake Fire Protection District in the next 10 years. Without additional resources, response times are likely to increase for existing residents.

District Commissioners are evaluating ways to fund the stations, fire engines and ambulances necessary to meet this increase in demand without relying on existing taxpayers. One funding tool is the use of impact fees.

Impact fees are a one-time payment by new development to cover a proportionate share of the stations, vehicles and equipment necessary to keep levels of service (response times) consistent as growth occurs. Impact fees are paid at the point of building permit for new construction only. Fees are not assessed for garages, sheds or additions to existing residential structures. Impact fees cannot be used to repair or replace existing capital, or to fund District operations.

In accordance with Idaho law, the Timberlake Fire Protection District and Kootenai County Emergency Medical Services System (KCEMSS) have prepared a capital improvement plan that outlines the capital investment required to serve new growth. These items include an additional fire station, additional firefighter quarters at Fire Station #5, a ladder truck, engine, water tender and ambulance.

The total cost of the growth-related capital is \$8 million. To recover these costs the Districts are proposing collecting an impact fee of \$2,974 per residential unit and \$1.49 per non-residential square foot.

The impact fees would be collected by the City of Athol and Kootenai County for the Fire District and KCEMSS.
