

City Hall Closed – Presidents' Day Holiday - Monday, January 20th, 2023.

- Water Service- A reminder to take an extra look at your water services in your home, since we do not read meters in the winter, to be sure you don't have any broken or frozen water lines or even small leaks.

WINTER REMINDERS

- The first priority is to clear the main streets to allow for the passage of traffic. Then as time allows, we will go back and begin clearing and pushing back the sides and do any clean up.
- It is unlawful to push, shovel, blow, or place snow on to the public streets. Instead push the snow into the swales and yards.
- Please pull vehicles into the driveway and remove personal property from the street, right-ofway, and swales. This helps our plow driver remove as much snow as possible off the city streets and ensures the roadways stay as wide as possible as snow accumulates.
- Snow berms are an inconvenient result of plowing. Our plows in residential areas are equipped with a gate. However, gates only reduce the size of the berm, they don't necessarily eliminate a snow berm. Snow gates are subject to weight and amount of snow.

Please don't forget to shovel out your fire hydrants, as it is the responsibility of the property owners.

Firefighters need at least 3 feet of clearance around your fire hydrant to be able to locate it and use it quickly. Our city code states that you should not park within 8 feet of them. In case of

fire, seconds count and can make the difference in saving your home and possessions.

If you have a fire hydrant in your yard, remember that you are not just helping you and your family, but all your neighbors, stay safe.

Bestowing the Basics is a local nonprofit organization that launched in January of 2022 to service Athol, Bayview, and other surrounding communities. <u>Our mission is simple</u> - to meet and fill the varying needs that arise for individuals and families living in small, rural, underserved north Idaho communities, providing the most basic and necessary essentials to help feed, clothe, clean, warm, and shelter them, nurturing their needs, cultivating relationships, serving in love, building community.

In our first year, we poured over \$45,000 directly back into our communities, making large weekly donations to our food bank. Through our Family Assistance Program, we provided aid to those who experienced unforeseen hardship, loss of employment, or loss of a loved one. In December, we adopted 12 different families, consisting of 40 children, that we provided gifts for at Christmas.



We did so much more in our first year, in large parts to the generosity of our citizens, small businesses, and the City of Athol.

On <u>Tuesday, February 7th</u>, we'll be hosting what's called "Distribution Day", giving away personal hygiene and household items for men, women, and children; free while supplies last.

This link is from the United States Department of Transportation Federal Railroad Administration's website. We thought it might be helpful to ask our local community to report a blocked railroad crossing, as we have two railroad crossings here in town.

We are all seeing the ever-increasing traffic congestion and delays. If you are too, feel free to report it on this site. Go to the fra.dot.gov website < under report a blocked railroad crossing.

You will be given a few short questions/areas to complete your report. Such as:

What was the reason the crossing was blocked: (Multiple choice)

- Stationary Train;
- Moving Train;
- no train but lights flashing/gates were activated

When did you observe the crossing was blocked? (blank block for you to write in date and time)

If you witnessed the train start and stop, how long was the duration?

Were you aware of any immediate impacts from the crossing blocked (multiple choice)

- First responders observed being unable or delayed from crossing the tracks
- Pedestrians observed climbing on, over, through the train cars
- Other Box opens for you to write in your comment

Any additional comments/information about this event? (i.e. school arrival/dismissal disrupted; postal or other deliveries delayed; fewer customers visiting businesses, traffic congestion/gridlock, etc.)
