Rapid Reflective Flashing Beacons are up!!

Our Public Works Director, Kevin Foster, got it done! He worked with ITD, and the RRFB's are up. The City secured a Child Pedestrian Safety Grant early last year, and after the long winter, they are up. There are two sets along Highway 54 at 3rd Street and at Davis Lane.





Also, part of that grant was for the first sidewalks in the city. The Sidewalks were nearly finished last fall when the snow decided to move in for the winter. We expect those to be finished soon. Athol will soon have safer path for children and pedestrians to walk along. The sidewalk is along Menser from the Athol Elementary school down to 3rd Street.



Did you know

....There are 2 types of Public Hearings, <u>Legislative</u> and <u>Quasi-Judicial</u>.



A Legislative Public Hearing is your opportunity to give testimony. They are less formal, and they do not involve the legal rights of specific, private parties related to an application before the city. They affect a wider range of citizens or the city as a whole.

A Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing, unlike a legislative one, involves the legal rights of specific parties, and the decisions made as a result of such hearings must be based upon and supported by the record developed at the hearing. They have stricter procedural requirements than legislative hearings. They involve land use matters, including site specific rezones, preliminary plats, variances, and special use permits.

- ➤ <u>Information from Deputy Goodman</u> Deputy Goodman, of the Kootenai County Sheriff's Department would like to share that there has been a string of license plates stolen off local trailers and would just like you to keep an eye out. Call 911 if you see or hear anything.
- ➤ Bennett Avenue Reconstruction Project Big Sky Corp. will be onsite to begin their road project for the city from the beginning of May through mid-June. We are reconstructing Bennett Avenue, paving the back parking lot at City Hall, and adding parking on the east and west sides of the park. They will return near the end of July to do the Chip Seal on Menser from Old Hwy 95 to 1st Street.
- ▶ <u>Lend a Helping Hand</u> Since we have no longer been doing the City-Wide Beatification, we ask that you be a good neighbor, see if your neighbor needs something you might be able to help with. One of the best things about a small community is that we all know each other and can be there for one another, for not just the big things but those small daily things too. We ask that you reach out if you have the means or are physically able to lend a helping hand on some small projects for your neighbors. Take their garbage to the dump, help them rake their yards, or do a little weeding or mowing and say hello.
- ➤ <u>Public Hearing</u> on May 16th There is a request for a Condition Use Permit (CUP) by Good Hope Baptist Church, and a possible amendment of the Sewage Management Plan (SMP), ORD 443. Public testimony will be taken on both matters beginning at 6:00pm.
- ➤ <u>Budget for FY 2024</u> is just getting under way Our 1st workshop will be May 16th at 5pm. This is the Council's first review of the current fiscal year and beginning to look at the next fiscal year, identifying projects and goals for the upcoming year.
- The City has made comments to Kootenai County with concerns regarding the Bunko Base Camp RV Park application. It is proposed to be located just across the street from Super 1 and host up to 70 campers. There were a range of concerns from traffic impacts, possible year-round use, and water and septic related matters.


