Cut down dead trees and clear fallen trees or branches from around your house. Please know that if a tree or something from your property falls into your neighbor's property or the city's right of way it is your responsibility to get it cleaned up. Always use caution and be safe.

As the winter season begins it is a good reminder to be as prepared as you can by having fresh batteries in your flashlights, a few days' supply of food and water, as well as stock up on medicines and heating fuel. And again, be sure to clean up your yards and home from debris before another storm hits and secure loose





outdoor objects such as patio furniture.

If you see damage to utility lines or city water lines, stay away and please contact the proper authorities. If you're unsure whose responsibility it is or who to call, you can always contact City Hall. 208-683-2101.

Did you know... CITY ORDINIANCE #270, Passed in 2008, it discusses the need to keep our roads and right of way clear for snow plowing. If there is 4 inches or more in a 24 hour period, the city will plow the city roads. It is the property owner's responsibility to remove any vehicle or other object in the street or right of way that may impede plowing

operations. DO NOT park or leave a parked vehicle or other objects in the street or the right of way. If they are left in the street or right of way they are subject to a citation and/or removal, at the owner's expense and may be plowed in.
