<u>Did you know</u> that the City Code has extensive regulations for signs? Commercial signs can only be located on the same premises as the business they are advertising. The Code has restrictions for size and placement. Most signs require approval of the City Council prior to installation. Certain types of signs, such as real estate "for sale" signs, do not require city approval. If you are considering putting up a new sign, please contact the City to find out if it requires City approval prior to installation.

Update from Mayor Wachter:



- Water Rates will go up approx. 4% amounting to either \$0.50, \$1.00, or \$1.50 a month increases based upon your rate level; this will be effective October 1st 2016. Your City Council and Mayor feel it's important to plan responsibly, and the city's water system is 25 plus years old and has not had any increases. A Capital Facilities Water Plan is being created, it will identify where improvements and upgrades are needed and what types of things will be most effective. Our water system and the quality of our water is in the forefront of your elected official's minds. Smaller
- increases now, can help to lessen the burden of huge costs when it's time to replace or repair.
- The Athol Community Review dates will be Tuesday October 4th, Wednesday October 5, and Thursday October 6th, 2016. Ideally, the review will help our city to be better prepared, to build on shared strengths and work together to achieve common goals. There are several opportunities for your input and participation beginning with: Listening Sessions (Sept. 7th & 8th), a survey which is mailed out or will be available on-line at: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/irpatholsurvey and is due back by September 16th, and finally the review dates itself (Oct 4th & Oct 6th). Please try to be a part in these opportunities, receiving input from as many of you as possible will help ensure the most success for the future planning of Athol.
- On an Enforcement Activity Note: Please understand that enforcement that is occurring is not the result of any new laws, but rather existing laws. At the direction of your current council, the city planner has been working to notify property owners of city code violations. Your current council is trying to apply and enforce what is already written in the city code, something that has not always been done in times past. It may take some time, but the city wants to work with everyone to try and find the best possible resolution while upholding the law as it is written.

What is a Community Listening Session?

Community Listening Sessions are an important part of the Athol Community Review. These sessions are happening September 7th-8, 2016. They allow a team of visiting professionals to learn what's on the minds of Athol citizens and community members.

We ask four simple questions, listen to the responses, and take good notes. A typical listening session takes 60-75 minutes and involves 12-15 participants.

You are being invited to participate in a listening session as a representative of one of the following stakeholder groups:

- Home Team
- Seniors
- High School students
- Other youth (e.g. 4-H, Scouts, home-schooled kids)
- Teachers and school administration
- Social Service providers, law enforcement, first responders
- Clergy and other representatives from local churches
- Business owners
- Homeowner Assoc. and others who live outside Athol city limits

Why do we do this?

The visiting team's goals are simple: we want to create an environment where participants feel comfortable speaking openly and honestly about priorities and concerns, and we strive to capture 'high-frequency' comments faithfully and reflect them back to the entire community. We don't take sides; we're there to listen. Ultimately, we want to provide your community with the best information about community perceptions and priorities.
